STEP ONE: RESEARCH



Think about the area you want to be in and the size of home your family requires. Consider amenities close by and the transport links, both current and future. Consider your timeframes, remember usually that house & land packages are sold "off-the-plan" meaning land is unregistered and can't be built upon until it does register.

Work out your budget and what you are able to borrow. Most people speak with a bank or mortgage broker to find out the options that are right for you.
